Mansi Majethia, is an ex-student of SEC Day school and a part of I&IP program which focuses on her vocational skills and livelihood enhancement.

She was diagnosed with Spastic cerebral palsy at birth with decreased muscle tone and stiffness in her limbs which restricts her movements. This hampers her from performing daily self-care activities like getting in or out of bed, eating, using washroom, dressing or contributing in household chores. She uses wheelchair to move around.

She completed 7th grade education. There are 4 members in her family and belong to the lower income class.

Mansi's mother is a pillar of support, showing unwavering love and belief in her daughter's potential.

Mansi's Training:

Mansi attends the center activities of I&IP regularly. Physiotherapy and yoga sessions at the center has improved her motor activities and postures.

She can now eat with her own hands now and has slowly started standing using crutches.

At the centre under vocational training, she learnt agarbatti making and excels in crochet work. Mansi is skilled in making mobile bags, handkerchief and woollen torans.

Under the livelihood enhancement program, Mansi was taught on sales, raw material costs, production cost and sales.

During the festivals, Mansi went to the temple located outside her home every evening and sold agarbattis made by her.

It was a very proud moment for her to be able to earn a living.







She took her handmade incense sticks and sold them outside her home, even while navigating her wheelchair. Her dedication to her craft and her commitment to improving her life and those of her loved ones is extraordinary.

Despite her physical limitations, she is determined to better her own life and to contribute positively to her home, making her parents proud.
